### **CCP** Overview

- Ohio's dual enrollment program for students to earn high school credit and college credit at the same time.
- Open to students in grades 7-12
- Students enroll in college courses and adhere to the requirements of the college

### **CCP** Overview

### • May apply to multiple institutions

- Most commonly used for CHS students are Edison & Sinclair
- Students must complete an assessment exam and be determined "eligible" based on exam scores or multiple measures

### What is College Ready?

College Ready means that students are prepared for the rigors of college coursework. They are a college student, and their grades impact both their high school & college GPA!!

### Things to Consider

#### **RESPONSIBILITY**

Students need to be responsible! These grades impact their high school & college GPAs.

#### **TIME MANAGEMENT**

Due dates, attendance, balance between school & activities. Colleges expect 2-3 hours of work for every hour spent in class.

#### **CONTENT**

Some classes will cover mature content. All CCP students must sign a waiver regarding this!

#### **ORGANIZATION**

Students need to do well with organization so they don't miss deadlines

#### **SELF-SUFFICIENT**

Students will need to be willing to contact their professors & the university if any issues arise.

### Guidelines

Students get a total of 30 semester hours each year

Regular high school classes must be included in this total

30 - (high school credits x 3) = maximum CCP hours Summer Classes count towards the following school year's 30 hours

Summer of 2022 counts for the 2022-2023 school year

Summer classes may not be used for sports eligibility If a student enrolls in more than 30 hours, they can either drop a course before the deadline or opt for self pay.

> Self Pay is handled directly by the university

There is a program maximum of 120 hours per student

### **Steps**

#### 1. **Counseling Session**

First time CCP students & parents must attend a counselling session

Submit a letter of intent form to Mrs. Ayres no later than April 1, 2023

This form must be filled out and turned in to the school counseling office no later than <u>April 1, 2023</u> in order to participate in CCP during the 2023-2024 school year.



### Application

Students must apply to the college they wish to use. Edison & Sinclair use online applications. This only has to be done once (returning CCP students do not need to apply again.)

# 4 Eligibility

There is more than one way to be eligible for the CCP Program:

Have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 or higher **OR** have a cumulative high school GPA of at least 2.75 but less than 3.0 and have an A or B in relevant high school course. Obtain a remediation free score on one of the standard assessment exams:

> ACT, SAT, Accuplacer, ALEKS, PlaceU, or MapleSoft

Colleges will review students' scores using statewide standards

### **Eligibility Table**

CollegeCredit STUDENT ELIGIBILITY ASSESSMENTS

Effective Academic Year 2018-2019, a student interested in College Credit Plus must meet statewide eligibility criteria. A student is considered Eligible for the program if the student scores at or above the "Assessment Threshold Score" in at least one subtest of an approved assessment exam\* in the table below.

If a student does not meet the Assessment Threshold Score in at least one subtest, but has scored within the "Score Range to be Considered" (calculated as the standard error of measurement), then the student can be considered **Conditionally Eligible** for the program if he/she also as a 3.0 cumulative GPA <u>or</u> receives a recommendation from school counselor, principal, or career-technical advisor.

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Sinclair registration is completed by the student online.

# Grades

- Any grades earned through CCP courses will be on the student's high school and college transcripts
- Grades will be factored into the high school GPA and the college GPA
- The grades students earn are on their college transcripts forever
- CCP courses follow the same grading scale we use at CHS for their high school transcript
- If a student fails or withdraws past the deadline frequently, future financial aid may be impacted negatively

# **CCP** Probation

A student is placed on CCP Probation if they are labeled an "underperforming student" as defined by the Ohio Administrative Code 3333-1-65.13 when a student meets at least one of these conditions:

- Has a cumulative GPA of lower than a 2.0 for all college courses taken through the CCP program
- Withdraws from, or receives no credit for, 2 or more courses in the same term. (Withdrawing from a course occurs when the student dis-enrolls from a course after the drop deadline and the secondary school is financially responsible for the tuition associated with the course.)

# **CCP** Probation Rules

Once a student has been placed on CCP probation, the following actions are put into place:

- A Student on CCP probation may enroll in no more than 1 college course and the student will not enroll in a college course in the same subject in which the student earned a grade of D or F or received no credit.
- If the student had already registered for more than one course prior to being placed on CCP probation, the student must disenroll from the course(s) as necessary.
- The student, as noted above, may continue to be enrolled in 1 course. The student must notify that college in which course they want to take

# **CCP** Probation Rules

- If the student fails to dis-enroll, the high school will promptly notify the student and parent(s) that they will be responsible for paying all tuition, fees, and textbook costs. The student is also considered an ineligible student and is dismissed from the CCP Program in the next term.
- If the student on CCP probation takes one course and the grade raises the student's cumulative college GPA to a 2.0 or higher, the student is removed from CCP probation and may participate in the program without restrictions.
- If the grade does not raise the cumulative college GPA to a 2.0 or higher, the high school is responsible for dismissing the student from the program.

# Cost

The cost of tuition, fees, and textbooks is paid for by Covington Schools.

Courses must be college-level or non-remedial Courses must be nonreligious



### Cost: When might I have to Pay?

#### Failure/Drop

If a student fails or drops a course past the deadline, the student/parent must pay all costs back to CHS. \*Must be paid by graduation

#### **Exceeding Limit**

2

If a student enrolls in more than 30 semester hours and opts for self pay, then the student/family will assume the costs for the course

#### Moving?

3

If a student moves schools in the middle of the year and you cannot continue your in progress CCP course(s) you will receive a W on your transcript & be responsible for all costs associated with the class(es)

# Credit Transfer

How do CCP credits transfer after graduation?

- Students must check with the colleges to confirm transferability!
- Courses generally transfer easily, especially from one public college to another public college

Work directly with the colleges you are interested in to ensure things will transfer the way you intend!! CCP Students are college students. The college views students as independent decision makers. The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) protects student education records.
